

2009 Grants

Save America's Treasures - FY2009 Applications will be available in early winter 2009, applications due in spring 2009, and awards made in late fall 2009.

FY2009 Application will be posted on this website and the deadline announced as soon as they become available.

Grants are available for preservation and/or conservation work on nationally significant intellectual and cultural artifacts and historic structures and sites.

Green Communities Grants:

- **Sustainability Training Grants** - Intended Uses of Funds - Funds may be used to cover the cost of conducting a Green Communities Sustainability Training session including the development and distribution of an operations and maintenance manual per the Green Communities Criteria. Expenses may include: cost of designing o&m manual, cost of printing o&m manual, cost of curriculum development, consultant fee for training; consultant travel costs, not to exceed \$1,000; training preparation costs, such as creating invitations, meeting and follow-up materials. Sustainability Training Grant applications are reviewed the first week of each month. Applicants will be notified by the end of that month.
- **Planning & Construction Grants** - Grants up to \$50,000 cover planning and construction expenses including additional costs of architectural work, engineering, site surveys and costs associated with items such as a more efficient HVAC system, green materials and energy efficient appliance. Enterprise offers two national rounds per year. Awards for the fall funding round are expected to be made by the first week of November.
- **Charrettes Grants** - Grants for up to \$5,000 to assist housing developers with integrating green building systems in their developments and engage in a serious discussion of green design possibilities. Enterprise will award planning grants to affordable housing developers to coordinate a green design charrette. Charrette applications are reviewed the first week of each month. Applicants will be notified by the end of that month.

The Kresge Foundation - We award planning grants ranging from \$50,000 to \$100,000 to organizations located in the United States and Canada to support the integrated design process for the following projects:

- Renovation
- Historic preservation
- New construction designed to achieve [LEED – Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design](#) – certification at the Platinum level from the U.S. Green Building Council

- New construction designed to meet the [Cascadia Region Green Building Council's Living Building Challenge](#) (also endorsed by the U.S. Green Building Council)
- New construction designed to be net-zero energy efficient (the facility produces as much energy as it consumes each year)
